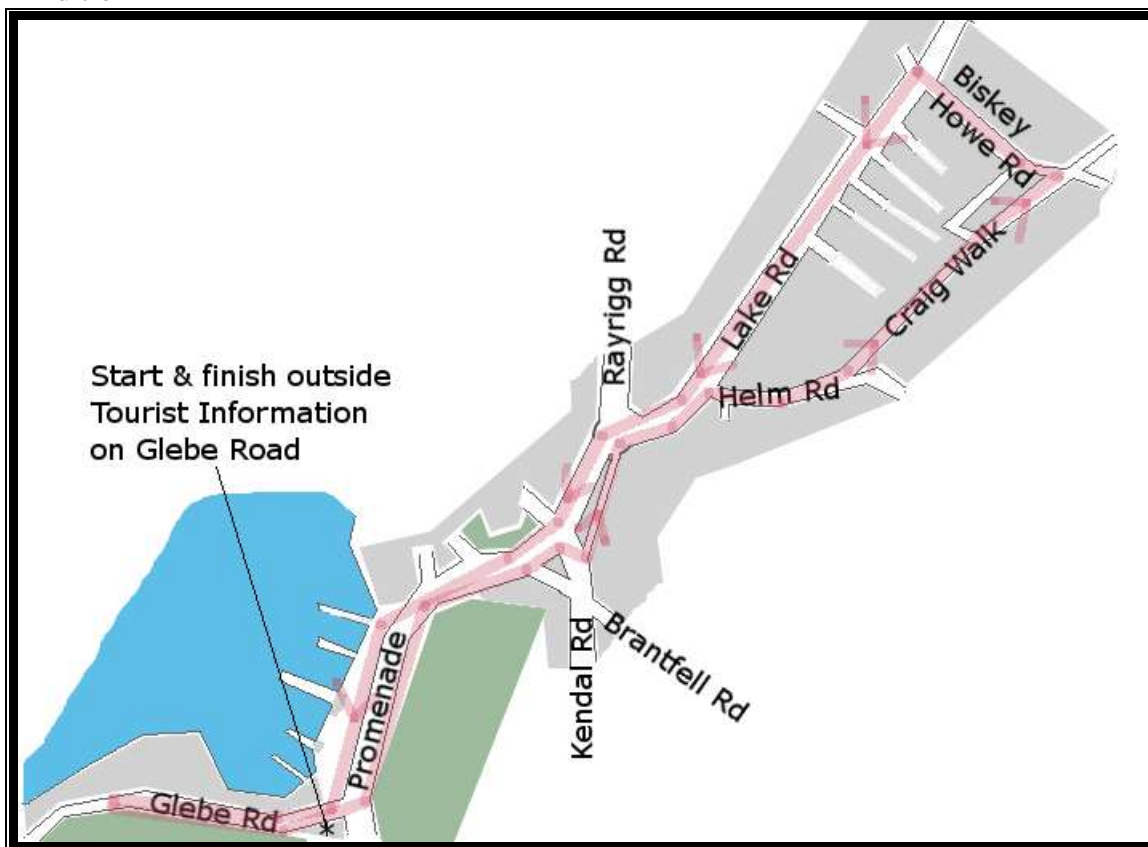


Bowness on Windermere Treasure Hunt

The route is approximately 1½ miles long and takes 1-1½ hours to complete. The only steps are on the Promenade and can be avoided so it is suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs although there are steep hills in places.

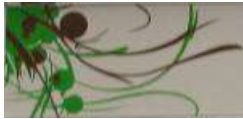
Parking can be found along Glebe Road.

Start outside the tourist information on the junction of Glebe Road and Promenade.


