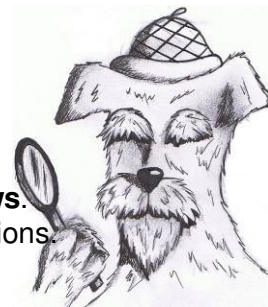


# Staithes Treasure Hunt


